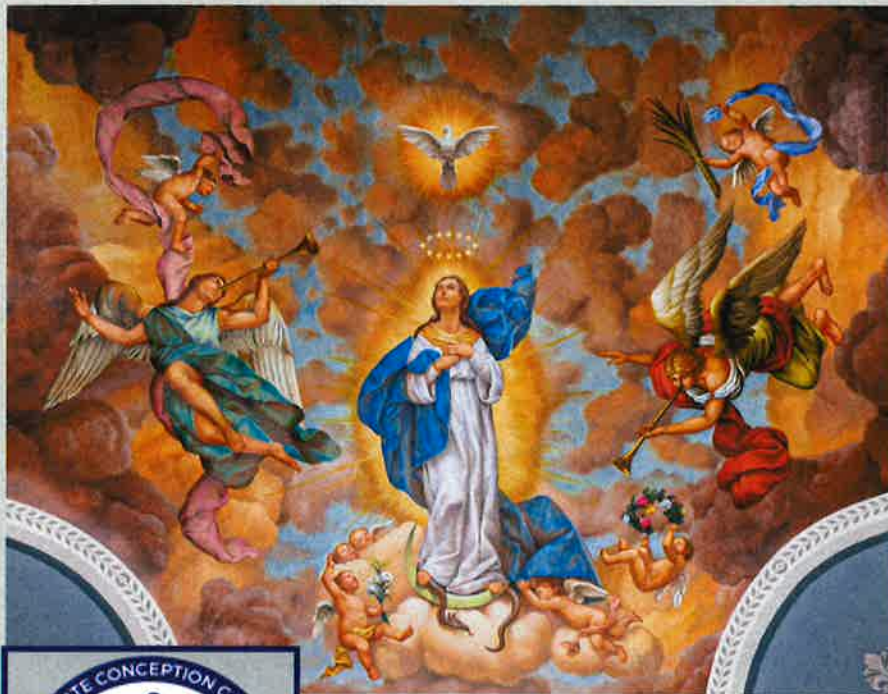

Anointing Of the Sick



One sacrament that is very often forgotten or is seemingly neglected in its theological treatment is the Anointing of the Sick, which is also known as Extreme Unction (last anointing). The Sacraments in general are

meant to extend the salvific actions of Christ into our own time. For example, Jesus' feeding/nourishing of his disciples and the hungry crowds takes place substantially in the Eucharist, Jesus' forgiving of sins takes place in confession/penance, and lastly Jesus mediating between God and Man as priest takes place in Holy Orders. In like manner the healing actions of Jesus Christ are continued in our own day in the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, "And he went about all Galilee...healing every disease and every infirmity among the people" (Mt. 4:23).

The Apostles give evidence of this continued ministry in the Acts of the Apostles and in the writings of St. James. Peter when confronted by a crippled man asking for alms responds, "...I have no silver and gold, but I give you what I have; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk" (Acts 3:6). The most common proof for the ministry of healing comes from the book of James "Is any one among you suffering? Let him pray. Is any cheerful? Let him sing praise. ¹⁴Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; ¹⁵and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. ¹⁶Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed" (James 5:13-16).

So why are we worried as Christians about whether or not sick persons recover from their sickness? It may seem as though being worried over one's health conveys a lack of trust in God, or of being overly fearful about death. This can be true, in fact the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains how, "Illness can lead to anguish, self-absorption, sometimes even to despair and revolt against God" (CCC 1501).

Who Can Receive?

Any baptized person who has the use of reason and is seriously ill with the possibility/danger of death. For the use of reason, this Sacrament is reserved for persons who are capable of committing personal since one of the main effects of the sacrament is healing from the effects of sins. Infants/toddlers below the age of reason (assumed to be persons below the age of seven), or persons with severe mental handicaps should not receive this sacrament since

they have no personal sins on their souls needing to be healed. Infants and children who are below the age of reason do not receive the sacrament of the Anointing, but instead would receive Baptism and Confirmation to become fully initiated Christians and configured to Christ. "Danger of death" does not mean that you should call the priest only when death is immanent, but instead much earlier when it becomes clear that the illness is serious and could lead to death.

Who May administer?

The Anointing of the Sick is only to be administered by a priest and never by a deacon or lay person. While it is the practice among some lay faithful to use "blessed oils" on sick persons, this is very different from the sacramental rite of Anointing of the Sick which is the ministry of healing Christ entrusts to his apostles, and he does so because the ministry of healing should always include the healing of our souls from the effects of our sins, spiritual/physical death. The use of blessed oils should, although allowed as a devout and holy practice, should never be confused with sacrament instituted by Christ.

Are there other ways to assist in this healing ministry?

Yes, there are many ways we are able to practice Christ's healing ministry today as faithful Christians such as:

1. Visiting and praying with the elderly/sick
2. Working in the medical profession
3. Writing letters to people who may be homebound
4. Offering to cook for people who may be suffering from an illness.

Due to the new directives from the State of Louisiana temporarily mandating masks to be worn in all business types, please wear a face mask in church.

If you, or someone in your household, is sick please do not attend Mass.

There are separate lines for Communion on the tongue or in the hand. Please follow the signs.

Given the circumstances, Bishop Provost is providing this prayer for the use of the faithful:

An Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least into my heart. I embrace You as if You are already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

(You may make this Act of Spiritual Communion anytime you need it and as often as you need it.)

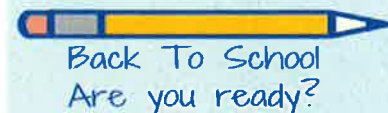

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM
