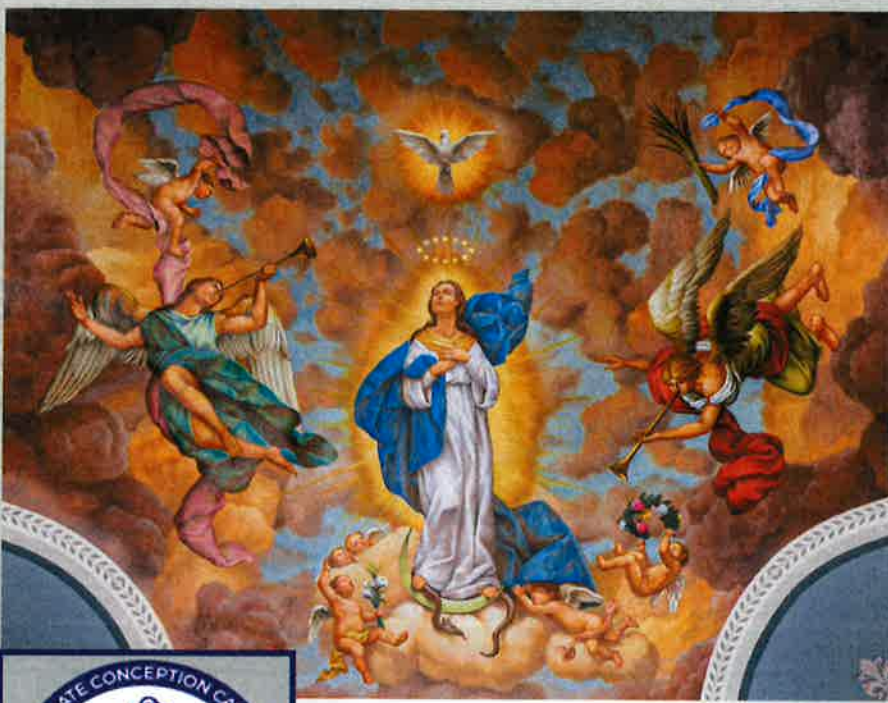

His Excellency celebrated the 12:05 p.m. Mass at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on April 22. Everyone was invited to attend. Several Priests, Religious, and lay faithful were present for the beautiful Mass. Later that afternoon, I presented a Spiritual Bouquet to Bishop Provost from the staff, parishioners and friends of Immaculate Conception Cathedral Parish.
